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### **ORDER:-**

In the letter first read above, the proposal of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Wildlife Warden seeking central assistance of Rs.107.455 lakhs for the Management Action Plan for Conservation and Management of Point Calimere Wetland, Tamil Nadu for the year 2019-2020 was forwarded to the Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change for approval and release of funds.

2 In the letter second read above, the Government of India has now conveyed administrative approval of a sum of Rs.70.7075 lakhs for implementation of Management Action Plan (MAP) for Conservation and Management of Point Calimere Wetland in Tamil Nadu during the financial year 2019-2020 under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 60:40 funding pattern, out of which Government of India share is Rs.44.8245 lakhs and remaining amount Rs.29.883 lakhs is State Government share. The Government of India have now released a sum of Rs.44.77 lakhs of the entire Central share and revalidated an amount of Rs.0.059 lakhs being unspent amount for the year 2018-2019 to the current financial year 2019-2020

3. In the letter third read above, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden has therefore requested the Government to accord administrative approval and sanction a sum of Rs.74.7075 lakhs (Rupees seventy four lakhs, seventy thousand seven hundred and fifty only) (Government of India share of Rs.44.77 lakhs + unspent amount pertaining to the year 2018-19 of Rs.0.059 + State share of Rs.29.8785 lakhs) to implement the scheme of conservation and management of Point Calimere Wetland during 2019-2020.

4. The Government after careful consideration accord administrative approval and release a sum of Rs.74.7075 lakhs (Rupees seventy four lakhs seventy thousand seven hundred fifty only) (Government of India share of Rs.44.77 lakhs + unspent amount pertaining to the year 2018-2019 of Rs.0.059 + State share of Rs.29.8785 lakhs) to implement the scheme of conservation and management of Point Calimere Wetland during 2019-2020.

5. The expenditure sanctioned in para 4 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

“4406 Capital Outlay on Forestry and Wildlife 02 Environmental Forestry and Wildlife – 110 Wildlife Schemes shared between State and Centre - UN Conservation and Management of Point Calimere Wetland complex in Tamil Nadu - 416 Major Works – 01 Major Works

(IFHRMS D P C: 4406 02 110 UN 416 01)”

6. Necessary funds of Rs.74.7075 lakhs will be provided in Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2019-2020. Pending provision of funds in Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation 2019-2020, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests is authorized to draw and utilize the amount sanctioned in para 5 above. However, this expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the Legislature by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimate 2019-2020. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests is directed to include this item of expenditure while sending the proposal for Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2019-2020 and also send draft explanatory note for inclusion of the expenditure in the Supplementary Estimate to Government in Finance (AHD&F / BG-I) Department without fail.

7. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden shall ensure that the expenditure does not exceed the sanctioned amount and the Utilization Certificate shall be sent to Government of India in time. He is also to ensure that the terms and conditions laid down by the Government of India in their letter second read above should be followed strictly.

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8. The details of item of work and expenditure and fund sanction details mentioned in the Government of India letter second read above shall be followed.

9. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O. No.65118/Fin(AHD&F)/2019, dated 06.01.2020 with ASL No.2739 (Two Thousand seven hundred and thirty nine).
