## ORDER:-

The Annual Plan of Operation (APOs) for the year 2019-2020 under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of "**Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats**" for National Parks / Wildlife Sanctuaries / Conservation Reserves, received from the State Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden for sanction and release of Rs.896.074 lakhs was forwarded to the Government of India in the Government letter first read above.

2. The Government of India, Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change, in their letter second read above have conveyed administrative approval for a sum of Rs. 876.224 lakhs (on sharing basis of Central Government 60% + State Government 40%) and released a sum of Rs.420.600 lakhs (i.e. 80% of overall Central Share) including unspent amount of **Rs.11.0952 lakhs** pertaining to the year 2018-2019 as first installment for implementation of "Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats" in three National Parks, 10 Wildlife Sanctuaries, 15 Birds Sanctuaries and two Conservation Reserves during the year 2019-2020. The 40% share of the State Government is Rs.350.4896 lakhs and 60% share of Centre is Rs.525.7344 lakhs.

3. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden has requested the Government to accord administrative approval for a sum of Rs.876.224 lakhs and also requested to release 1<sup>st</sup> installment amount of Rs.701.00 lakhs (Rupees seven crore one lakh only) (Rs 420.60 lakhs of Central share including the unspent amount of **Rs.11.0952 lakhs** pertaining to the year 2018-2019 + an amount of Rs.280.40 lakhs from the State share) as first installment for implementation of the "Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats" during the year 2019-2020.

4. The Government, after careful consideration, accord administrative approval for a sum of Rs.876.224 lakhs (Rupees eight crore, seventy six lakhs twenty two thousand and four hundred only) and release a sum of Rs.701.00 lakhs (Rupees seven crore and one lakh only) (Rs 420.60 lakhs of Central share including the unspent amount of **Rs.11.0952 lakhs** pertaining to the year 2018-2019 + an amount of Rs.280.40 lakhs from the State share) as first installment for implementation of "Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats" scheme in 3 National Parks, 10 Wildlife Sanctuaries, 15 Birds Sanctuaries and two Conservation Reserves during the year 2019-2020 as detailed below:-.

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5 The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden shall ensure that the details of item of work and expenditure and fund sanction details mentioned in the Government of India letter second read above shall be followed, strictly.

7. Necessary additional fund amounting to Rs.2,77,42,800 will be provided in Revised Estimates / Final Modified Appropriation 2019-2020 to meet the expenditure sanctioned in para 4 above. Pending provision of such funds, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden is authorized to incur the expenditure. However, the above expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the Legislature by a Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates for the year 2018-2019 and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests is also directed to include the expenditure sanctioned above while sending he budget proposals for Revised Estimates / Final Modified Appropriation 2019-2020 and also send draft explanatory notes for inclusion of this expenditure in Supplementary Estimates 2019 – 2020 to Finance (AHD&F/BG.I) department at an appropriate time without fall.

8. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden shall ensure that the terms and conditions laid down by the Government of India in their letter second read above should be scrupulously followed.
